Introduction and objectives of work

The Management of **Granules India Limited** (hereafter stated as “**Granules**” or the “Company”) have engaged Bureau Veritas (BV) for providing **Reasonable Assurance** engagement for BRSR (Core) parameters (**Refer to Annexure-1**) and **Limited Assurance** for non-core parameters (**Refer to Annexure-2**) provided in the Business Responsibility & Sustainability Report of the Company for the year ended March 31, 2026.

Intended User

The Assurance Statement is made solely for “Granules” and its stakeholders as per the governing contractual terms and conditions of the assurance engagement contract between “Granules” and “Bureau Veritas”. To the extent that the law permits, we owe no responsibility and do not accept any liability to any party other than “Granules” for the work we have performed for this assurance report, or our conclusions stated in the paragraph below.

The assurance engagement considers an uncertainty of $\pm 5\%$ based on materiality threshold for estimation / measurement errors and omissions.

Scope of Work

We have performed the **Reasonable Assurance** engagement as described in the Securities and Exchange Board of India’s (SEBI) circular SEBI/HO/CFD/CFD-SEC-2/P/CIR/2023/122 dated July 12, 2023 & SEBI/HO/CFD/CFD-PoD-1/P/CIR/2024/177 dated December 20, 2024 and clarifications thereto, read with applicable SEBI Regulations and prescribed format, as amended, for BRSR (Core) parameters and **Limited Assurance** engagement in accordance with International Standard on Assurance Engagements (ISAE) 3000 (Revised) and in line with the requirements of Bureau Veritas’s standard procedures and guidelines for external Assurance of Sustainability Reports, based on current best practice in independent assurance for the reporting period **1st April 2025 to 31st March 2026**.

As part of its Independent Assurance, we assessed the appropriateness and robustness of underlying reporting systems and processes used to collect, analyse and review the information reported. In this process, we undertook the following activities:

Assessment was conducted by means of physical site visits at Hyderabad's Corporate office, API Unit I, Finished Dosage Unit, R&D Units 1 & 3, API Unit IV & V.

Bureau Veritas interviewed personnel of Company including HR & Admin, EHS, Engineering & Maintenance, SCM, Finance & Accounts, Quality Assurance & Quality Control, Legal & Compliance, Information Technology and other relevant departments and review of Company's data & information systems for collection, aggregation, analysis and review.

- The assurance process involved carrying out an Assessment by experienced assessors from Bureau Veritas.
- The Company submitted performance data on reported BRSR Core Indicators. The data pertaining to selected sites was assessed by Bureau Veritas during the audit visit and through the process above described.
- Data on various BRSR Core disclosures was assessed for the locations as mentioned above. Later, it was confirmed that the same assessed data went into preparation of the final data within the BRSR Report of FY: 2025-26.

Management Responsibility

The Selection of reporting criteria, reporting period, reporting boundary, monitoring and measurement of data, preparation, and presentation of information in the Business Responsibility and Sustainability report are the sole responsibility of the Company and its management. We are not involved in drafting or preparation of BRSR (FY 2025-26). Our sole responsibility is to provide Independent Assurance on the Sustainability report for the financial year ended 31st March 2026.

Our findings

On the basis of our methodology and the activities described above,

- It is our opinion that Company has established appropriate systems for the collection, aggregation, and analysis of data on Sustainability/Non-Financial performance disclosures in the BRSR.
- The Business Responsibility and Sustainability Report (FY 2025-26) provide a fair representation of the Company's activities as included therein.
- The information is presented in a clear, understandable, and accessible manner, and allows readers to form a balanced opinion over the Company and status during the reporting period.

a) Reasonable Level of Assurance for BRSR (Core) Parameters:

On the basis of our methodology and the activities described above, it is our opinion that the for FY 2025-26 of "Granules India Limited", containing its reporting and declaration of the BRSR (Core) parameters from the operations within the reporting boundary and the reporting period, as described above, is prepared in all material respects in line with the applicable criteria here before stated and in accordance with "Reasonable Assurance" criteria.

b) Limited Level of Assurance for BRSR (Non-Core) Parameters:

Nothing has come to our attention to indicate that the BRSR (Non-Core) disclosures are inaccurate or that the information included therein is not fairly stated.

Limitations and Exclusions

Excluded from the scope of our work is any assurance of information relating to:

- Activities outside the defined assurance period.
- Positional statements (expressions of opinion, belief, aim or future intention by the Company and statements of future commitment).
- Competitive claims in the report claiming, "first company in India", "first time in India", "first of its kind", etc.



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Our assurance does not extend to the activities and operations of the Company outside of the scope and geographical boundaries as well as the operations undertaken by any subsidiaries or joint ventures of the Company.

Our assurance of economic and financial performance data or information on the Company is based only on the annual audited statement of accounts of the Company for the Financial Year 2025-26 and our conclusions rest solely upon that audited report.
